Smart Robots

The field of robotics is developing and robots are getting smarter every day. Nowadays, simple robots are able to work in factories¹. They have specific responsibilities in which they don't have to make their own decisions. However, smarter robots that can make their own decisions are also becoming a reality. These smart robots are called "service robots". No one has to tell these robots when and how to do their work; they know what to do by themselves. Amazon, a large U.S. company, for example, has service robots that work in packing boxes. Very soon, even ordinary people will have smart service robots in their homes! Imagine, your own service robot will tidy up your home or take out the garbage and you won't even have to make the request!

To help the service robots successfully deal with their responsibilities, a team of inventors² would need to give the robots relevant information. First, the robots would need information about the place where they would be working. The service robots would have a map of the building so that they wouldn't waste time looking for the right place. Robots would also need a picture of every single object they need to recognize or carry. The only way a robot can succeed is if it has all the necessary information.

Giving information to robots is a difficult job. First of all, consider the fact that teaching a machine takes a very long time. Also, the contents of a robot's "brain" are exactly what the scientists put into it, and no more. If you teach them to recognize oranges, they won't know what apples are. They might even have trouble with a lemon! This means that a robot cannot work well in a new place. Scientists are searching for ways to teach the robots in quicker and simpler ways.

Fortunately, a group called RoboEarth has managed to come up with a way to help solve this problem. All robots, no matter where they are in the world, would be connected to a head computer. When a robot in an apartment in Israel, for example, learns how to use a toaster, it can report the new information to the head computer and other robots can learn the new information too. You simply connect your robot to the head computer, and automatically the computer will share the latest information with your robot.
