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
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The colors we like and the doodles we draw are windows to who we are our personalities and our feelings. In this unit, you will learn about yourself and your friends by learning about colors and doodles.

What Your Favorite Color Says About You

Quick! Don't think about it. Just say the first thing that comes to your mind when you read this question:

What is your favorite color?

According to psychologists, the color you like best says a lot about your personality.

It is connected to the way you act, the people you enjoy spending time with, how you study and the clothes you choose. In other words, your favorite color is one key to understanding ... YOU!

What about colors you *don't* like? Often, when people don't like a color, it is because of something that happened to them years ago. Try to remember when you first

- started to dislike the color. For example, if you don't like green, think about when you began to feel this way. Did you use a green blanket in the first grade when you were sick in bed for a week? That may be why you don't like green today.
- Find your favorite color below and see what it says about you. Of course, some people have more than one favorite color. If you like two colors about the same, read the information on both of them.

White

You are logical, organized and neat. You don't like a messy room or messy relationships with people. You are an optimist, and you can always find the positive side of things. You are independent – you can take care of things yourself. You are careful with money.

Yellow

You are cheerful, creative and spontaneous. You love learning. You are fun to be with, and you have lots of interesting ideas. You like to wear nice clothes. You prefer "thinking" games to active games and sports. You sometimes try to hide your feelings. You are good with technology.

Pink

You have a positive way of looking at life, and you see the good in everyone.

You are very sensitive – sometimes too sensitive – and you want to feel safe and loved. You are kind. You take good care of everyone in your life, including both family and friends, and you show them that you love them. People feel safe and comfortable with you.

Red

Purple

Cognates

The article on pages 9-10 uses many cognates. A cognate is an easy word to remember because it sounds very similar to a word you already know in your language, and it has the same meaning. Cognates can help you understand what a text is about.

Language 1 Adjectives

Adjectives are words that make writing interesting. Adjectives describe nouns by giving more information, such as size, color, age or personality. They answer questions like which one, what kind, or how many.

When you use adjectives to describe people, you can give details about physical appearance or personality.


