### No More Plastic Toys

**I** In Skye Neville's bedroom, there is a box full of plastic toys. There are plastic pens, small plastic animals, pieces of plastic jewelry and all sorts of other plastic toys. Ten-year-old Skye got all these toys from a youth magazine that she likes to read. But Skye never plays with any of these cheap plastic items. Instead, she collects them in a box to show people how many useless plastic items she has received. This is how Skye fights to improve the environment in her country, Britain.

**II** "These toys break after you play with them for a minute, and they end up in the garbage," says Skye. "One of the pens I got doesn't even work. Who wants this stuff?" Skye is also upset by the magazine's plastic package<sup>1</sup>. She thinks that the publishers should wrap the magazine in a paper package, which is much better for the environment. "Why do we need all this plastic garbage sitting around?"

**III** Skye wrote a letter to the magazine's publishers. She asked them to switch to paper packages and to stop sending cheap plastic toys. But the publishers didn't agree to make the changes. So, rather than give up, Skye wrote a letter to the British government about this problem, and over 3,000 people signed<sup>2</sup> her letter. Skye's letter to the government made a big difference. The government is attempting

to influence publishers to stop using plastic packages and to stop giving out plastic toys with children's magazines. One popular supermarket has already announced that they will no longer sell magazines that include plastic toys.

**IV** Skye's father, a postman, said he is proud of how hard his daughter has worked. "What she has achieved is amazing. She is a real hero with a strong character. There are always loads of magazines along my route, and I was unhappy about the amount of plastic they use. But Skye actually managed to do something about this problem. I hope it will make the youth of our nation realize that they can influence others if they really care about a problem."
